INTRODUCTION

The Directors wish to seek the approval of the Shareholders at the Annual General Meeting for the granting of the Issue Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate and the proposed re-election of Directors.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

The purpose of this circular is to (a) provide you with details of the Issue Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate; (b) present the proposal for the re-election of Directors; and (c) give you notice of the Annual General Meeting.

GRANTING OF THE ISSUE MANDATE AND THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

Three ordinary resolutions numbered (4), (5) and (6) in the notice of the Annual General Meeting will be proposed in relation to the Repurchase Mandate, the Issue Mandate and the extension of the Issue Mandate to issue and allot additional Shares representing the total number of Shares which may be purchased by the Company under the Repurchase Mandate are as follows:

(a) Repurchase Mandate

Ordinary resolution numbered (4) set out in the notice of Annual General Meeting will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to give a general and unconditional mandate to the Directors to exercise the powers of the Company to repurchase at any time during the Relevant Period (as defined in ordinary resolution numbered (4) set out in the notice of Annual General Meeting) Shares representing up to a maximum of 10% of the total number of Shares in issue of the Company as at the date of passing such resolution.

The Directors will seek the approval of the Shareholders for the grant of the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the requirements set out in the Listing Rules. The explanatory statement required by the Listing Rules to be sent to the Shareholders in connection with the Repurchase Mandate is set out in the Appendix I to this circular.

(b) Issue Mandate

Ordinary resolution numbered (5) set out in the notice of Annual General Meeting will also be proposed that the Directors be given a general and unconditional mandate to issue and allot during the Relevant Period (as defined in ordinary resolution numbered (5) set out in the notice of Annual General Meeting) additional Shares representing up to 20% of the total number of Shares in issue of the Company as at the date of passing such resolution. As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were in issue an aggregate of 6,831,182,580 Shares. Assuming that no Shares are issued or repurchased by the Company prior to the date of the Annual General Meeting, such 20% will represent 1,366,236,516 Shares.

In addition, an ordinary resolution (ordinary resolution numbered (6) set out in the notice of Annual General Meeting) will be proposed to extend such general mandate to issue Shares by adding to it an amount representing the aggregate number of Shares in issue of the Company repurchased by the Company under the Repurchase Mandate.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

To facilitate future allotment and issue of Shares by the Directors on behalf of the Company, the Directors will seek the approval of the Shareholders for the grant of the Issue Mandate at the Annual General Meeting.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

According to Articles 115(A) and 115(B) of the Articles of Association, at each annual general meeting of the Company, one-third of the Directors for the time being, or if their number is not three or a multiple of three, then the number nearest to but not exceeding one-third, shall retire from office by rotation. The Directors to retire in every year shall be those who have been longest in office since their last election but as between persons who became Directors on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree between themselves) be determined by lot. A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-election.

Furthermore, according to Article 115(D) of the Articles of Association, every Director, including those appointed for a specific term, shall be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years and the Directors to retire shall be decided by the Board.

In accordance with Articles 115(A) and 115(D) of the Articles of Association, Mr. Wong Edward Gwon-hing, Mr. Yam Tat Wing, Mr. Yu Shiu Tin, Paul and Mr. Sze Irons shall retire from office by rotation and all of them are eligible for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Pursuant to paragraph A.4.3 of Appendix 14 to the Listing Rules, any further appointment of an Independent Non-executive Director serving more than 9 years should be subject to a separate resolution to be approved by shareholders. Both of Mr. Chan Ping Kuen, Derek and Mr. Yu Shiu Tin, Paul have served as Independent Non-executive Directors for more than 9 years. While, Mr. Sze Irons has served as an Independent Non-executive Director of the Company since October 2008, which is close to 9 years' of service. Mr. Chan Ping Kuen, Derek, Mr. Yu Shiu Tin, Paul and Mr. Sze Irons met the criteria set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. The Company has received from Mr. Chan Ping Kuen, Derek, Mr. Yu Shiu Tin, Paul and Mr. Sze Irons a confirmation of independence pursuant to Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules and they have not engaged in any daily executive management of the Group. Taking into consideration of their independent scope of work in the past years, the Directors consider Mr. Chan Ping Kuen, Derek, Mr. Yu Shiu Tin, Paul and Mr. Sze Irons to be independent under Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rule. Also, having considered their valuable knowledge and experiences in the Group's business, the Board believe that the re-election of Mr. Chan Ping Kuen, Derek, Mr. Yu Shiu Tin, Paul and Mr. Sze Irons as Independent Non-executive Directors are in the best interest of the Group and the Shareholders as a whole.

Details of retiring Directors proposed for re-election at the Annual General Meeting are set out in Appendix II to this circular.

LETTER FROM THE BOARD

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The notice of the Annual General Meeting is set out in this circular. At the Annual General Meeting, ordinary resolutions will be proposed to approve the granting of the Issue Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate and the re-election of Directors.

A form of proxy for use at the Annual General Meeting is enclosed with this circular. If you are not able to attend the Annual General Meeting, you are requested to complete the form of proxy in accordance with the instructions printed thereon and return it to the registered office of the Company at Flats M and N, 1/F., Kaiser Estate, Phase III, 11 Hok Yuen Street, Hung Hom, Kowloon, Hong Kong not less than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the Annual General Meeting. Completion and return of the proxy form will not preclude Shareholders from attending and voting at the Annual General Meeting if they so wish.

RIGHT TO DEMAND POLL

Pursuant to Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, any vote of the shareholders at a general meeting must be taken by poll except where the chairman, in good faith, decides to allow a resolution which relates purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands. The chairman of the Annual General Meeting will demand a poll on each of the resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting. The results of the poll will be published on the website of the Stock Exchange and at the website www.continental.com.hk on the business day following the Annual General Meeting.

RECOMMENDATIONS

The Board considers that (a) the granting of and the extension to the Issue Mandate and the Repurchase Mandate and (b) the re-election of the Directors as described in the section headed “Re-election of Directors” above are in the interest of the Company and its Shareholders as a whole and accordingly recommends you to vote in favour of all the relevant resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

APPENDIX I EXPLANATORY STATEMENT OF THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

The following is the explanatory statement required to be sent to Shareholders under the Listing Rules in connection with the Repurchase Mandate.

SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the total number of Shares in issue of the Company comprised 6,831,182,580 Shares. On the basis that no further Shares are issued or repurchased prior to the Annual General Meeting, exercise in full of the proposed Repurchase Mandate can accordingly result in up to 683,118,258 Shares being repurchased by the Company during the course of the period ending on the earliest of the date of the next annual general meeting, the date by which the next annual general meeting of the Company is required to be held by law and the date upon which such authority is revoked or varied.

REASONS FOR REPURCHASES

The Directors believe that it is in the interests of the Company and its Shareholders as a whole to seek a general authority from Shareholders to enable the Directors to repurchase Shares in the market.

Repurchases may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, result in an enhancement of the net assets and/or earnings per Share. The Directors are seeking the grant of the Repurchase Mandate to give the Company the flexibility to do so if and when appropriate. The number of Shares to be repurchased on any occasion and the price and other terms upon which the same are repurchased will be decided by the Directors at the relevant time, having regard to the circumstances then prevailing.

FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

Repurchases of Shares must be funded out of funds legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Articles of Association and the Companies Ordinance. Repurchases of Shares pursuant to the Repurchase Mandate would be financed entirely from the Company's available cash flow or working capital facilities. Any repurchases of Shares will be made out of funds of the Company permitted to be utilised in this connection, including profits otherwise available for distribution.

APPENDIX I EXPLANATORY STATEMENT OF THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

There might be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company (as compared with the position disclosed in its most recent published audited financial statements dated 30 June, 2017) in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent as would, in the circumstances, have a material adverse effect on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

EFFECT OF THE TAKEOVERS CODE

If as a result of a repurchase of Shares, a Shareholder's proportionate interest in the voting rights of the Company increases, such increase would be treated as an acquisition for the purposes of the Takeover Code. Accordingly, a Shareholder or group of Shareholders acting in concert, depending on the level of increase of the Shareholder's voting right at the time, could obtain or consolidate control of the Company and may become obliged to make a mandatory offer in accordance with Rules 26 and 32 of the Takeover Code.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Tamar Investments Group Limited, a company wholly owned by Dr. Chan Sing Chuk, Charles, his wife, Ms. Cheng Sin Yin, Shirley and Mr. Chan Wai Lap, Victor ("Mr. Victor Chan"), Chairman of the Board, and all being the Executive Directors of the Company, were interested in 5,063,395,220 Shares, representing approximately 74.12% of the issued Shares of the Company as at such date. Mr. Victor Chan, was also interested in 2,700,000 ordinary shares, representing approximately 0.04% of the issued Shares of the Company. On such basis, if the Repurchase Mandate is fully exercised by the Company, it will increase their aggregate percentage shareholding in the Company to approximately 82.40% (*Note*), and such increase will not give rise to an obligation to make a mandatory offer under the Takeovers Code. However, in such circumstances, repurchase of Shares under the Repurchase Mandate would result in the number of Shares held by the public being reduced to below 25%.

Note: The percentage were calculated based on the Company's issued number of Shares of 6,831,182,580 Shares as at the Latest Practicable Date and on the assumptions that there is no other change in the issued number of Shares of the Company and that none of the share options issued by the Company are exercised prior to Annual General Meeting.

Save as aforesaid, the Directors are not aware of any consequences which may arise under the Takeover Code as a result of any repurchases made under the Repurchase Mandate. The Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent that would result in the total number of the issued Shares of the Company held by the public being reduced to less than 25% as required under the Listing Rules (or the relevant prescribed minimum percentage required by the Stock Exchange).

APPENDIX I EXPLANATORY STATEMENT OF THE REPURCHASE MANDATE

DIRECTORS AND THEIR ASSOCIATES AND CONNECTED PERSONS

None of the Directors nor, to the best of their knowledge and having made all reasonable enquiries, any of their associates (as defined in the Listing Rules), have any present intention to sell any Shares to the Company or its subsidiaries under the Repurchase Mandate if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

No connected persons (as defined in the Listing Rules) of the Company have notified the Company that they have a present intention to sell Shares to the Company and no such persons have undertaken not to do so, if the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

UNDERTAKING OF THE DIRECTORS

The Directors have undertaken to the Stock Exchange that they will exercise the Repurchase Mandate in accordance with the Listing Rules, all applicable laws of Hong Kong and the Articles of Associations.

REPURCHASES MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company has not purchased any Shares (whether on the Stock Exchange or otherwise) in the six months preceding the date of this circular.

MISCELLANEOUS

In the event of inconsistency, the English text of this circular shall prevail over the Chinese text.

The following are the particulars of the retiring Directors proposed for re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Mr. Wong Edward Gwon-hing, aged 54, joined the Group in 1998, and has been appointed as Executive Director of the Company since 1 March 2014. He is also the General Manager of Continental Jewellery (Mfg.) Limited (“CJM”). Mr. Wong has over 30 years experience in manufacturing, sales marketing and management in jewellery industry. Mr. Wong is responsible for overall development and management of the Group’s jewellery business.

Mr. Wong has not held any directorship in any public listed companies in the last three years and does not have any relationship with any other directors or senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Wong is interested in 30,000,000 underlying shares pursuant to share options (within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Future Ordinance) of the Company.

Mr. Wong has been appointed as an Executive Director of the Company since 1 March 2014. There is no service contract entered into between Mr. Wong and the Company for acting as an Executive Director. Mr. Wong has entered into a letter of appointment as an Executive Director of the Company for a term of service for three years and is subject to termination by either party by giving six months’ written notice. He is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the Annual General Meeting of the Company in accordance with the Articles of Association. Being an Executive Director of the Company, Mr. Wong will not be entitled to a director’s fee. Being a General Manager of CJM, Mr. Wong will be entitled to receive a monthly salary of HK\$118,000 and year end discretionary bonus, which is determined by reference to his duties and responsibilities with the Company, the Company performance and the prevailing market situation.

The Company confirms that it is not aware of any other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders and there is no other information which is required to be disclosed pursuant to the Rule 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules.

Mr. Yam Tat Wing, aged 64, joined the Group in 2011 as General Manager – Business Development and Mining of the Group. He was appointed as Executive Director on 1 March 2014 and was re-designated as Non-executive Director of the Company on 1 January 2017. Mr. Yam was educated up to matriculation and he obtained a certificate in Personnel Management from the Hong Kong Polytechnic (now known as The Hong Kong Polytechnic University).

Prior to joining the Group, Mr. Yam had served in the Hong Kong Police Force (the “Force”) for over 37 years, he was previously Deputy Commissioner, Operations from January 2007 to March 2010. Mr. Yam has extensive experience in leadership, public administration and crisis management.

During his career in the Force, Mr. Yam was awarded the Silver Bauhinia Star Medal, Colonial Police Long Service Medal with 3rd clasp, the Colonial Police Medal for Meritorious Service, the Hong Kong Police Medal for Distinguished Service and Chief Executives Commendation. In August 2011, he was appointed an Affiliated Fellow of Wu Yee Sun College of The Chinese University of Hong Kong for a term of five years. The appointment has been extended for another term of five years in August 2016. He was also appointed as Executive Board member, Hong Kong Air Cadet Corps with effect from 2 December 2015.

Mr. Yam has not held any directorship in any public listed companies in the last three years and does not have any relationship with any other directors or senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

Mr. Yam was re-designated as a Non-executive Director of the Company with effect from 1 January 2017. He has entered into a letter of appointment as a Non-executive Director of Company with no specific term of appointment but is subject to termination by either party by giving three months’ written notice. He is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at the Annual General Meeting of the Company in accordance with the Articles of Association.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Yam is interested in 2,400,000 ordinary shares and 20,000,000 underlying shares pursuant to share options of the Company (within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Future Ordinance) of the Company. As a Non-executive Director of the Company, Mr. Yam is entitled to a director’s fee of HK\$50,000 per annum. As an Executive Director of the Company up to 31 December 2016, he was entitled emoluments of HK\$1,011,000 (including salaries, and retirement scheme contributions), which is determined by reference to his duties and responsibilities with the Group, the Group’s performance and the prevailing market situation.

The Company confirms that it is not aware of any other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders and there is no other information which is required to be disclosed pursuant to the Rule 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules.

Mr. Yu Shiu Tin, Paul, *BBS, MBE, JP*, aged 67, was appointed as an Independent Non-executive Director on 25 April 2005. Mr. Yu is a businessman who has been actively engaged in the construction business both in the public and private sectors in Hong Kong for the last 40 years. He is a fellow member of the Hong Kong Institute of Construction Managers. Other than his working experience in managing a construction company, he has also actively involved in the community services of Hong Kong and has served several advisory bodies of Hong Kong Government for over 30 years. He was subsequently awarded as an unofficial Justice of the Peace by the Hong Kong Government in the year 1989 and awarded the Bronze Bauhinia Star by the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region Government in the year 2007. Mr. Yu is the Chairman and an Executive Director of K. H. Group Holdings Limited (Stock Code: 1557), a company listed on the Stock Exchange.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Yu has not held any directorship in any public listed companies in the last three years and does not have any relationship with any other directors or senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

No services contract has been entered into between Mr. Yu and the Company. Mr. Yu has no fixed term of service with the Company but he is subject to retirement by rotation and re-election at annual general meeting of the Company in accordance with the Articles of Association.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Yu does not have any interest (within the meaning of Part XV of the Securities and Futures Ordinance) in the Shares of the Company. For the financial year ended 30 June 2017, Mr. Yu is entitled to a director's fee of HK\$50,000 which is determined with reference to his duties and responsibilities with the Group, the Group's performance and the prevailing market situation.

Mr. Yu has confirmed in writing his independence in accordance with the Listing Rules. Based on such information and Mr. Yu's past performance, the Board believes that Mr. Yu continues to be independent.

The Company confirms that it is not aware of any other matters that need to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders and there is no other information which is required to be disclosed pursuant to the Rule 13.51(2)(h) to 13.51(2)(v) of the Listing Rules.

Mr. Sze Irons, *BBS, JP*, aged 55, was appointed as an Independent Non-executive Director on 2 October 2008. Mr. Sze graduated with a Bachelor's degree in Science from University of Wisconsin-La Crosse, United States in 1985. Mr. Sze has extensive experience in investment and corporate management and is currently a Non-executive Director of China Weaving Materials Holdings Limited (Stock Code: 3778) and BeI Global Resources Holdings Limited (Stock Code: 761) and an Independent Non-executive Director of Chevalier International Holdings Limited (Stock Code: 25), these companies are listed on the Stock Exchange. He is also an Executive Director of a private company, Hang Tung Resources Holding Limited, and holds directorship in various private companies. Mr. Sze is a member of the National Committee and an executive member of the Beijing Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference, and currently the Permanent Honorary President of the Chinese Manufacturers' Association of Hong Kong.
